Greetings again everyone. It's hard to believe, but this summer is just flying by. It seems like just yesterday we were celebrating Memorial Day and now we're just a month away from Labor Day and the end of summer.

Exit Road Got an Early Start

A lot has happened here in the Park during the last month, as I'm sure you know by now we had the exit road sealed to extend its life. I know, I know, I said it would be closed from July 19th through the 21st and it was closed a day early. Well, the scoop was that Granite Construction sub-contracted out the work and somewhere, they got their days crossed up and showed up a day early. My first thought was to not allow them to start, but then after talking with the representative from Granite that I originally spoke with, they offered to knock \$500.00 off the price if we allowed them to start a day early, and the rest is history. So now you know the rest of the story. It was a little confusing at first but the Park saved \$500.00.

Tree Trimming and Removal

Other happenings around the Park include the removal and trimming of many of the trees that have been posing an imminent threat to many of the homes here in the Park. So far during the last month we've

trimmed almost eight trees and removed eleven. Most of the trees removed were Cottonwoods, White Firs, Tan Oaks, and Bay Laurels.

Fortunately, so far, only three of the trees were Redwoods. I will try to keep everyone informed as to which trees will be coming down in the future so you will know what's happening.

Steve Webb from Webb's Tree Service, the person that has been taking down the trees in the Park, has to finish up some work for Big Creek Lumber at UCSC next week and then afterwards will be going on vacation. So he doesn't think he will be back in the Park until September, which means August should be pretty quiet.

August's Bird of the Month: The Violet-Green Swallow

This is the most common of the swallows that put on their aerial displays over the river. They are often thought of as heralds of spring, but they hang around eating our bugs through the summer.

Streamlined for Flight

Swallows are small, slender, sparrow-sized birds, about 5 inches in length. They have a streamlined form, long pointed wings and a notched tail. Their legs and bills are short, but their mouths are wide for capturing flying insects.

Male Violet-Green swallows have glossed violet-green backs (another one that makes sense!) and are clear white below with large white flank patches that nearly meet over the tail. It's that white flank that will be the most obvious field mark to differentiate it from the other swallows. The white of the face partially encircles the eye looking like an eye patch.

The females are a bit duller; the young are brown above and have a less conspicuous eye patch, but the white flank is like the adult's.



Masters of the Air

They are masters of the air, winging over the river (where we watch them) apparently effortlessly for hours. As they fly they dip down to the surface of the river to drink and bathe.

These strong, elegant fliers catch insects in midair, more or less sucking them up as they fly in graceful swoops and glides over the river.



Section 6 Observers

We're getting some help here... Yvonne Kirby in Section 6 let us know that in late June, she had nesting Hooded Orioles, and the mother brought the young birds to her jelly feeder. (In San Jose, orioles visit my hummingbird feeder.) She had the handsome yellow and black male around, too.

She also had Violet-Green Swallows nesting in a bird house on her front porch. She says she loves it when the swallows arrive because they eat all the bugs.

Let us know if you see something exciting.

anywhere near an area that tree work is being done, pay attention to what is happening.

I couldn't believe what I was seeing as the Redwood tree in front of the Stone house at the bottom of cardiac hill was being taken down. Steve Webb had the road closed in both directions, Lou had the road blocked on the cardiac hill side and I had the road blocked on the Keystone side. All the sudden out of nowhere comes a jogger running down Keystone, through the barricades, through the brush that was laying on the street and past me wearing a headset with the music blasting — completely oblivious to what was going on. I screamed for him to stop and — just as he did — about a 30- foot branch out of the top of the tree came down like a lawn dart and hit the street about 10 feet from where he was standing. So again **PLEASE** be careful when you are around any tree work that is being done.



Summer Building Projects

Now, on to the next subject, it appears that during the last few weeks many of you have started building projects around your homes. Decks, room additions, new roofs etc. This is all fine; however, you're not supplying the Office with a copy of your building plan to forward to the Park's building committee for their review — and in some cases, not having the necessary permits from the County.

During the past few weeks, I have had to ask three Members to stop their construction until they submit

the necessary paperwork for review. Some of these projects are along the river and require not only permits from the County but from the Dept. of Fish and Game because of the riparian corridor.

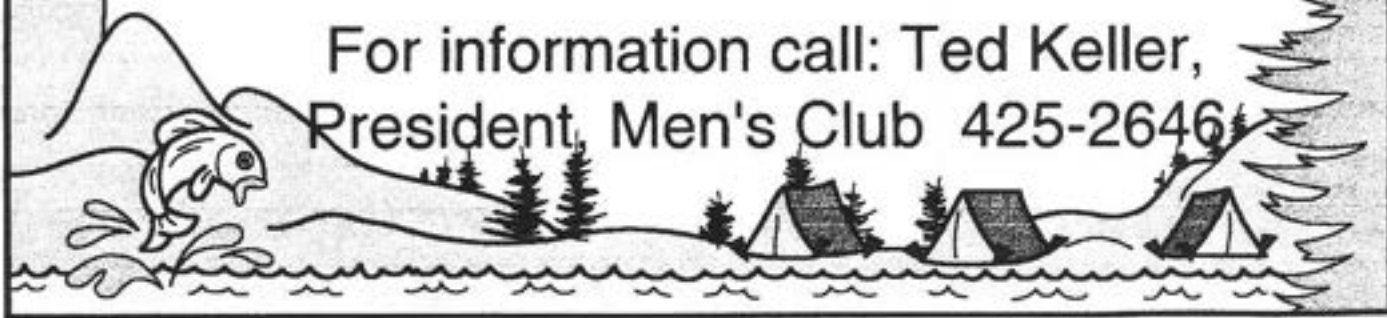

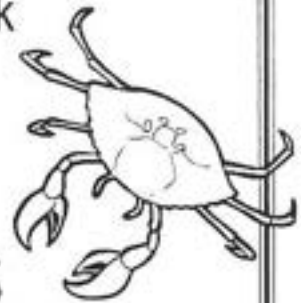
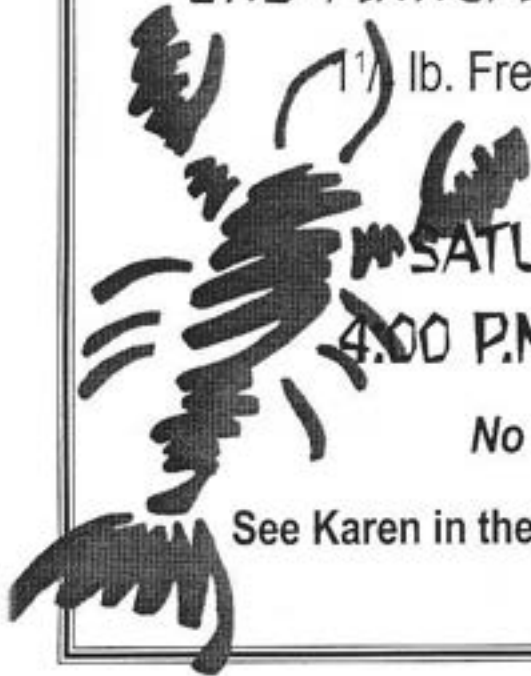
